Buried in the St. Patrick's Catholic Cemetery, in Truxton, NY, there is an Ann McGrath who died on May 25, 1883, at the age of 87 years (b.~1796). Her monument is on the north side of the McGrath (John W. and Ellen Comerford) monument. Ann died in DeRuyter but she was buried in Truxton. During a later search of the Irish Parish Registers (Catholic) it was discovered that Ann's maiden name was Cawley.

Above is a picture of Ann McGrath's monument in the Truxton Catholic Cemetery. This picture was taken in July 1999 while facing north. On most of the monuments in this cemetery the main inscription is on the eastside of the monument. There were some monuments that were shared between families that used both sides for their main inscriptions. In the case of Ann's monument there is only one inscription and it is on the south side – as if the eastside was being saved for someone else, like her husband Patrick.

According to Doug Currie, Ann's husband was Patrick McGrath and they were listed in the 1850 Federal Census as living in Pompey and having 2 children. The 1855 NYS Census found Ann and Patrick living in Fabius. According to the 1860 Federal Census Patrick was 50 and Ann was 60 and both had been born in Ireland. They had a son Miles, age 17, who was also born in Ireland.

Patrick died on Feb. 20, 1893 (Cazenovia Death Certificate #581) at the age of ~86 years (b.~1807). The certificate also stated that he is buried in the Truxton Cemetery even though there is no engraving on his wife Anna's monument that would indicate that he is buried there.

Introduction

Patrick and Ann McGrath had always been interesting because of their possible connection to the Edmond and Mary Ryan McGraw (McGrath) family of Truxton.

In this paragraph all the evidence that has been found prior to 2014 concerning Patrick and Ann is summarized. Their children were both born in Ireland. Since Miles, the youngest child, was born in Ireland the family came to the U.S. after 1843. Miles McGrath or Miles McGraw wasn't found in the ship list on line from the National Archives that cover the period 1848-1851. Therefore the family appears to have arrived in America between 1843 and 1847. In the 1910 US census for the town of Cazenovia, Miles reported that he entered the U.S. in 1848.

In the obituary of their daughter Mary McGrath Nix it stated that she came to America at the age of fourteen which means that the family came to the US in 1846, which is consistent with the information in the paragraph above. In July 2015 the Irish Parish Registers (the church baptism and marriage records) went online at the National Archives web site. Through this resource three records were found for this family and Ann's maiden name was discovered to be Cowley/Cayle and that the family had come from Mayne civil parish, Co. Westmeath. This answered a basic question: Patrick and Ann McGrath were NOT related to my gg-grandparents, Edmund and Mary McGrath, who were from the Upperchurch area of Co. Tipperary.

Only Patrick and Ann's daughter Mary McGrath ever married. She and her husband Thomas Nix had 9 children and 8 of them lived to adulthood and married. In this paper all eight of those families will be traced out. This process will utilize census records, newspaper stories, maps, land records, obituaries and cemetery lists.

The information on Patrick's death certificate states his mother was Jerusha Vibbard and she was born in Connecticut. This is obviously a transcription error since Patrick's parents never immigrated to America prior to his birth in 1807.

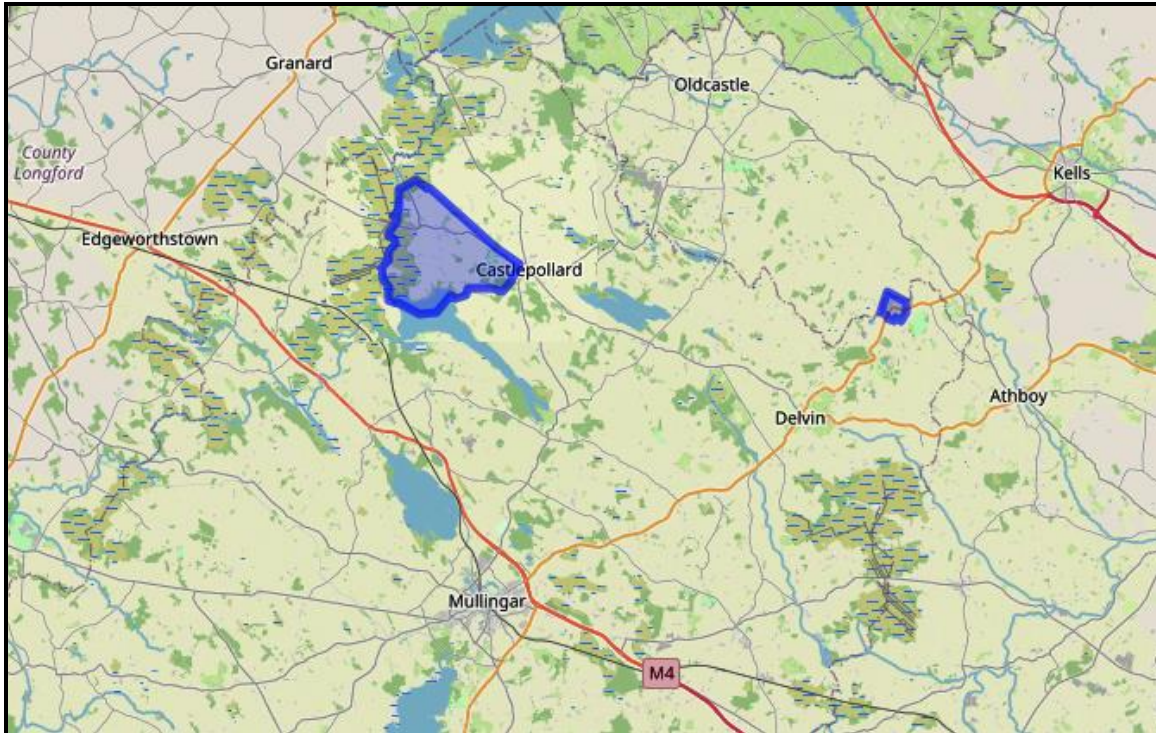

The baptism record of Patrick and Ann's son Miles could not be found. There were missing records in the baptismal records for Mayne parish. Missing were: Apr 1836 to Feb 1847 which included the time period of 1843 in which Miles' record was expected to be found. Also missing were the baptismal records in the period Nov 1820 to Apr 1824.

This origin shows that the Patrick McGrath family is possibly more closely "related" to the McGrath families of Madison County, several of whom were from nearby Co. Meath, Ireland.

Patrick McGraw was recorded as a 63 year old male whose occupation was that of a farmer. He had land valued at \$5000 and personal property valued at \$200. He was born in Ireland. His wife **Ann McGraw** was 73, born in Ireland. Also living with the family was their 25-year-old son **Miles** whose occupation was recorded as a farmer and he was also born in Ireland.

Tax Information – There is information from the tax rolls researched by Shirley Maloney that showed that Patrick paid taxes on 116 acres of land on Lot 100 in the Town of Cuyler in 1864, 1869 and 1870.

Residence Information

The 1876 map of Cuyler didn't show any P. McGrath. Neither did the map of the Town of Truxton dated 1876. Using the location of Patrick's farm on Lot 100 in the Gazetteer and Business Directory and the name sequence from the 1860 census it was possible to locate this farm on the 1876 map of the Town of Cuyler.

The 1860 census shows that Henry Shaw was recorded just prior to Patrick McGraw. On the 1876 map (see next page), in Lot 100 there is a farm occupied by Mrs. Shaw, probably Henry Shaw's widow, next to the Shaw farm is A. C. Ellis who occupied a farm of 116 acres. The farm occupied by Ellis was the same 116 acre farm occupied by the Patrick McGraw family between 1860 and 1870.

On the 1875 D. G. Beers' Cazenovia map there is a **P. McGrath** occupying a farm on Lot 59 in the Road Township District. According to the 1880 census there were two P. McGraths in the Town of Cazenovia. One was a Peter McGraw age 8 living with his parents and a Peter McGraw, age 51, living on the Orren Reynolds farm. Neither of these individuals would have been recorded on the 1875 map as P. McGrath. Therefore Patrick McGraw is a possible candidate for the P. McGrath.

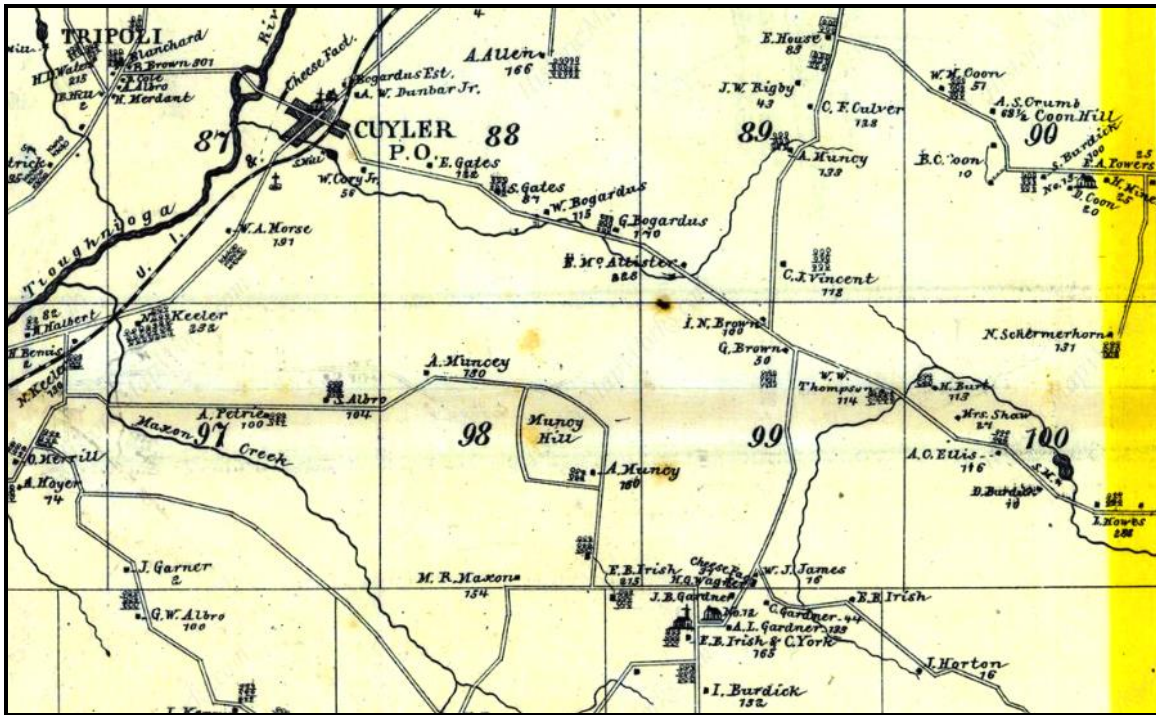
By 1880 Patrick is in the Town of DeRuyter just south of Cazenovia. Therefore Patrick had moved from Lot 100 in the Town of Cuyler to Lot 59 in the Town of Cazenovia and by 1880 had relocated to the Town of DeRuyter

Ann McGraw died in DeRuyter in May 1883 (at age 86). Patrick McGraw died 20 Feb 1893 in the Town of Cazenovia (at the age of 87). He died of a broken neck when he fell on the ice. The records indicated that he had been a resident of the town for eight years. Therefore Patrick had moved from DeRuyter back to the Town of Cazenovia around 1885 shortly after the death of his wife.

The certificate also said that Patrick's father's name was Miles. This would indicate that Patrick and Ann were following the traditional Irish naming convention by naming their first son after the paternal grandfather. There was no information on Patrick's mother but one might guess that her name was Mary since Patrick and Ann named their first daughter Mary.

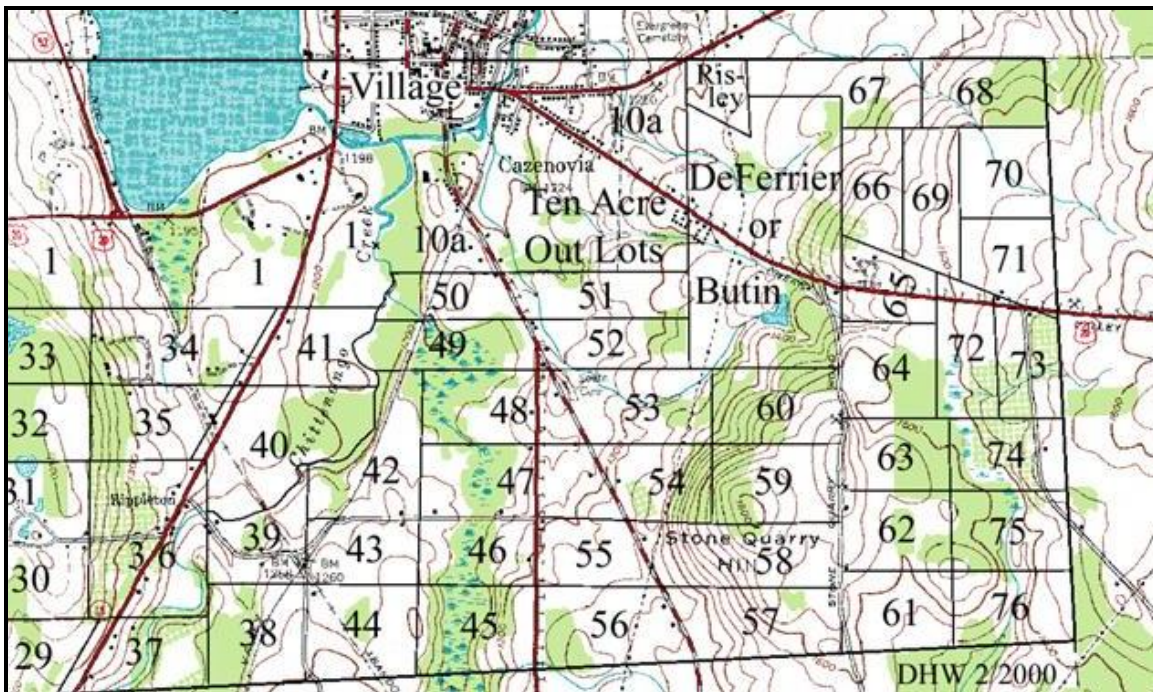
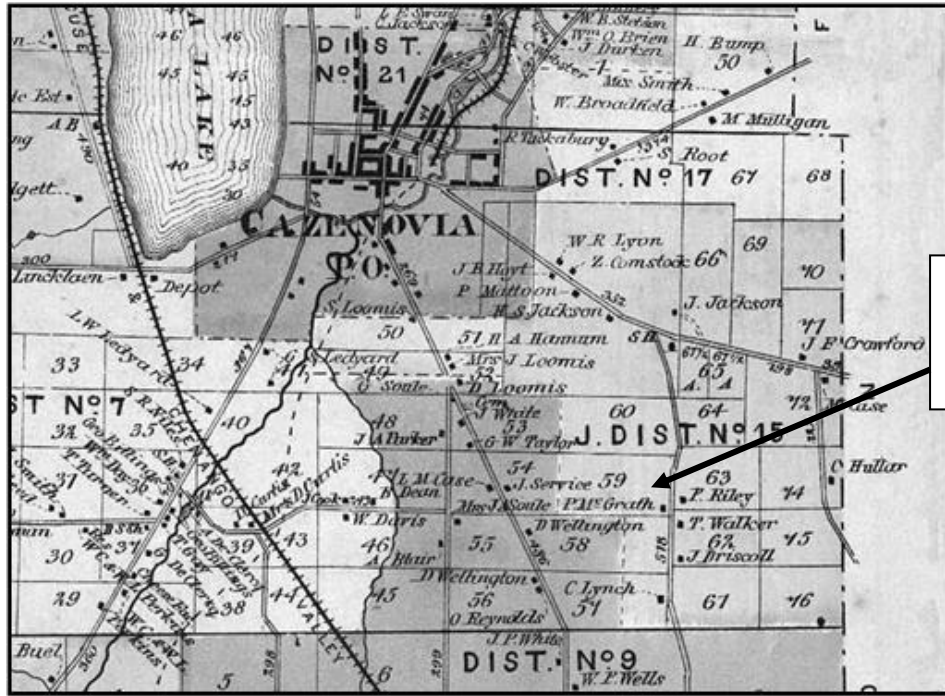

The Fulton History Newspaper Archive was searched for items related to the McGraths

((Syracuse OR Cazenovia OR Cortland) w/2 "NY") AND ((Anna OR Patrick) w/2 (McGrath OR McGraw OR Magrath)) AND (filename contains(1855~~1900))

Nothing related to Patrick McGrath was found. The social item columns weren't published in the local newspaper until the 1900 - 1940 time period.

Mary McGrath (dau. of Patrick and Ann McGRATH) married Thomas NIX on Nov. 18, 1856 by Michael W. Rooney at Cazenovia. Witnesses: Anthony NIX and Margaret NIX.

Thomas and Mary NIX had a son John born 15 Aug. 1857. At the time of the 1870 census he would have been 12 and wasn't listed as living with his parents. He was too young to be on his own or working for another farmer. Perhaps he had died.

Thomas Phelan was the husband of Hanna NIX. Hanna died Dec. 3, 1868 (age 32 years). Since Thomas Phelan was living with Thomas NIX in 1870 Hanna was probably a sister of Thomas NIX.

John NIX mentioned on the adjacent grave is probably a brother of Hanna and Thomas.

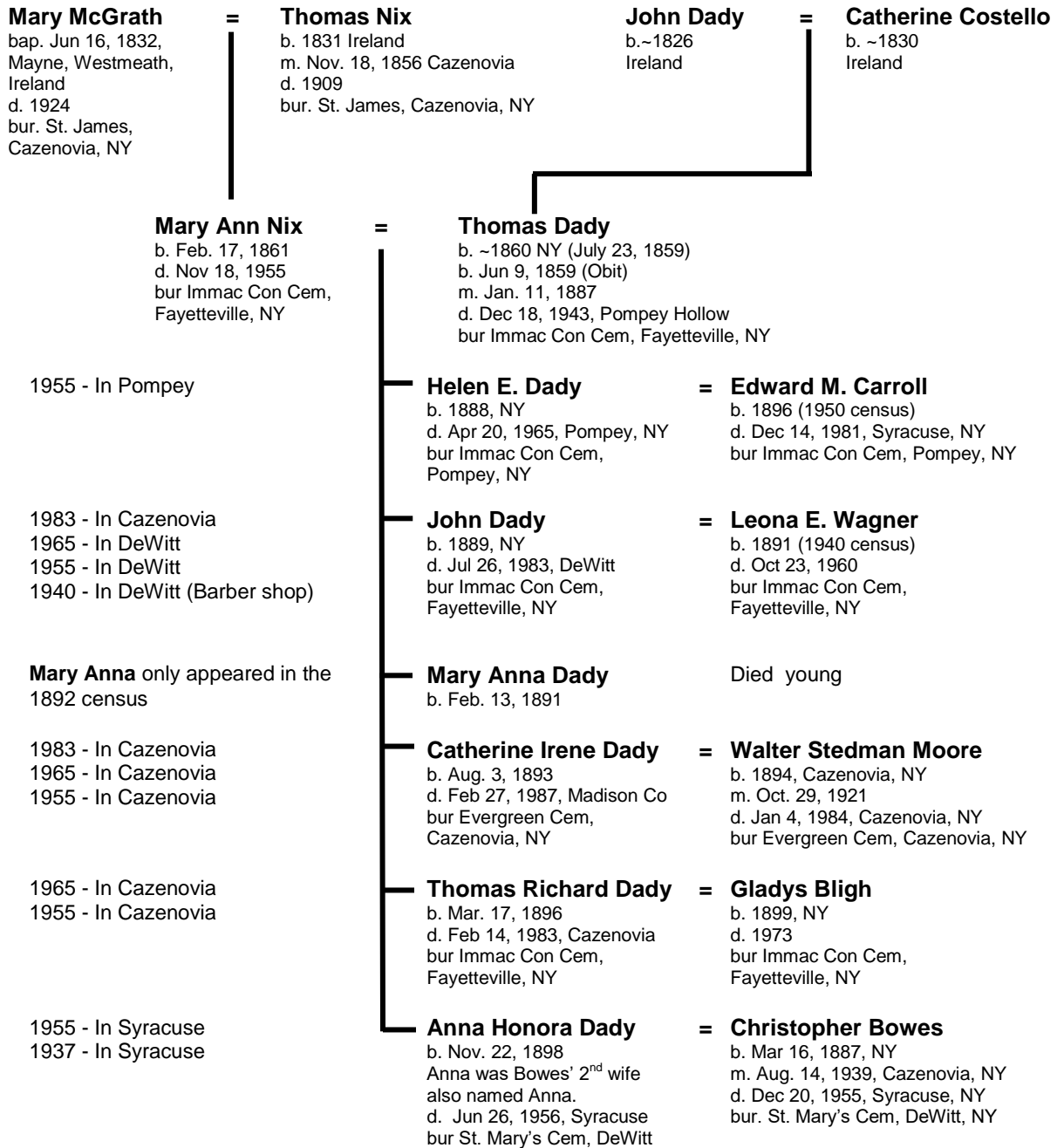

“The Cazenovia Fire Department responded to a 2-2 alarm early this morning when the large dairy barn, garage, milk house, and chicken house together with all their contents on the farm of **Thomas R. Dady** at Pompey Hollow were destroyed by fire. The Manlius Department also responded to the call arriving shortly after the Cazenovia Department.

“Included in the loss were 100 tons of hay, 4 or 5 cows, a bull, chickens, truck and milking machine.

“The origin of the fire has not yet been determined. The loss was partly covered by insurance.

“The 2-2 alarm was turned in a second time by mistake — there was only this one fire.”

Day To Be Observed With Dinner Party for Family

“Fifty years ago next Wednesday on a day 20 degrees below zero and the snow so deep that the trains didn’t run, the groom the day before having to wade half way from Erieville to attend his own wedding, **Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Googin** were married at St. James church, Cazenovia, by the **Rev. Father James Meagher**. That was the year of the ‘Roscoe Conklin blizzard.’ The ceremony was held at 9 a.m., the witnesses being **Mrs. Thomas Burke**, now of Perryville, sister of the bride, and the late **Nicholas Googin**, brother of the groom.

“The bride’s maiden name was **Nora Nix**, the daughter of **Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Nix** of Cazenovia. The groom was the son of **Mr. and Mrs. Richard Googin**, also of Cazenovia.

"Mr. Googin was then employed by the Chenango Branch Railroad with headquarters at Earlville and it was there that the newly married couple went to live. Three years later they were burned out in one of Earlville's two big fires which took several business blocks and residences in the central part of the village. Having lost their home and most of their furnishings they went to Rippleton, Mr. Googin having been transferred to the Cazenovia-Oran section. In 1907 they came to Cazenovia and have lived here ever since.

"For 27 years Mr. Googin was section foreman on the Chenango Branch. 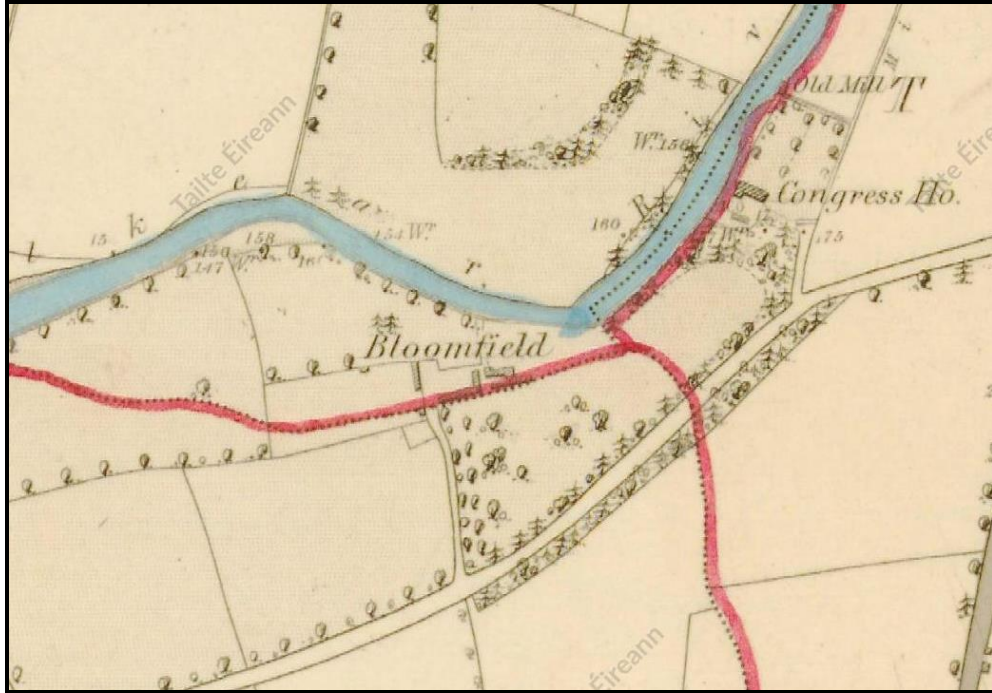

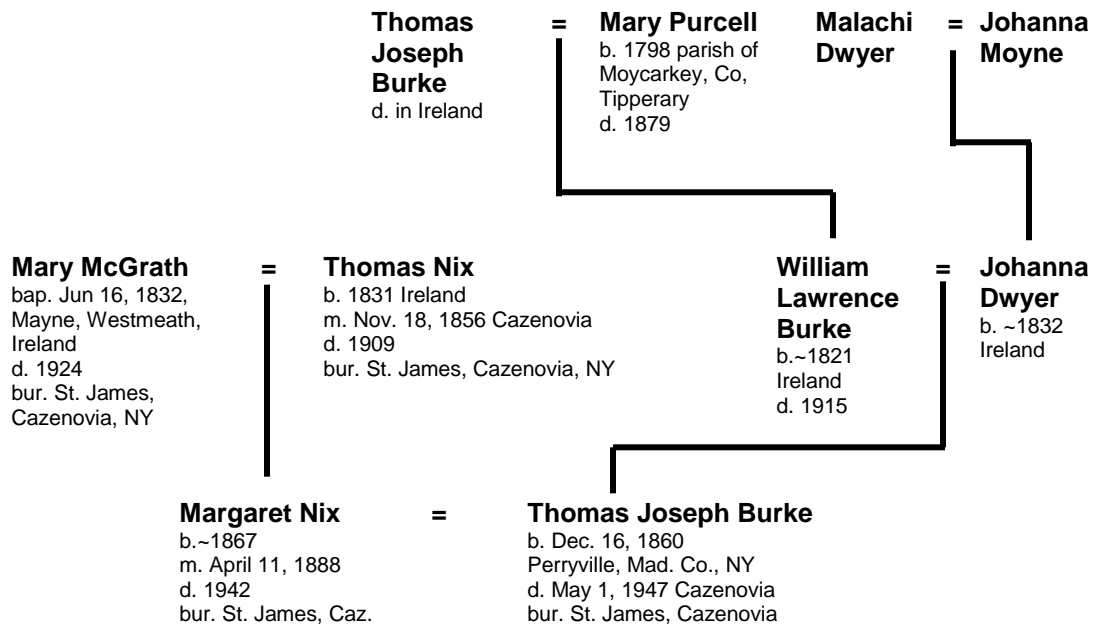

Outspoken Cazenovia woman started teaching before women received suffrage

“Madison County's oldest registered voter has died.

“**Marjorie Burke** of Cazenovia, who helped elect Warren G. Harding, Herbert Hoover and Franklin D. Roosevelt to the White house, died Saturday at 106. Born in Fenner, she died in the home she shared with her sisters, **Florence P. Burke**, 94, and **Anne B. Gaughan**, 97.

“In a story in The Post-Standard last October, burke was blunt concerning her political views for the fall 2000 presidential election. She said she would vote for George W. Bush because he opposes abortion, an issue she expounded on at length.

“‘Think of all the great people that have been killed.’ She said at the time. ‘We might have great nurses now taking care of the sick, and we might have doctors that weren't bent on making profit, but working for the community.’

“She also was against the death penalty, said people should do more to remember the elderly in nursing homes and support children so they do not resort to violence when they become angry.

“A staunch Republican, Burke made it a point to vote in every election and primary. Her nephew **Thomas Gaughan**, said even though she was a Republican she voted for Democrat Roosevelt probably because of the depths of poverty she saw while living in New York city during the Great Depression.

“‘She would come to Perryville during the summer, where there was no suggestion of the Depression or poverty she saw,’ he said.

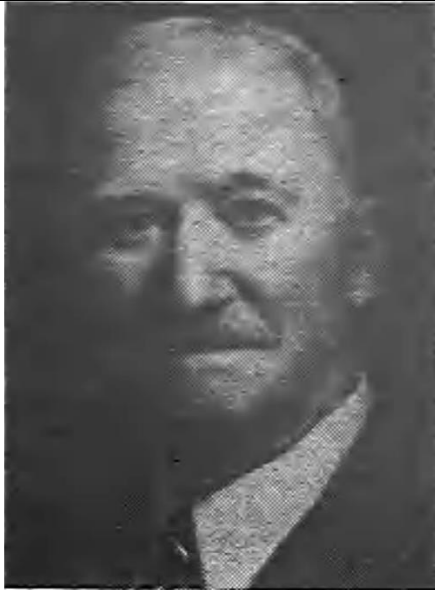
“She was an informed voter, reading the newspaper and watching television news. Gaughan said she stayed informed until just a few days before she died, always ‘researching everything she'd get involved with’ and carefully thinking through any question asked of her.

“‘She was very successful and very intelligent,’ he said. ‘We are all blessed to have known her.’

“Burke, who never married, graduated from Cortland Normal School and Fordham University, and was a special education teacher in New York City, beginning a few years before the 19th Amendment gave women the right to vote in 1920. In the middle 1950s, she moved back home and opened a bookstore — Burke and Gaughan Book Store — at Albany and Lincklaen street.”

William L. Burke, Former District Attorney, Dies from Stroke

“Former District Attorney **William L. Burke**, 53, died Sunday morning at his home in Hamilton. He suffered a stroke the previous afternoon while watching the Penn State - Colgate baseball game and never recovered consciousness.

“A native of Perryville, he was born February 7, 1889, one of 10 children in the family of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Burke. He was graduated from Perryville union school and from Cazenovia Seminary where he was a baseball and basketball player in 1908. Entering the Syracuse University law school he received his degree there in 1910. He was twice elected Madison county district attorney.

“In 1938 he was sent from the 39th senatorial district as a delegate to the state constitutional convention. He won newspaper headlines there by a dramatic appeal for a bill allowing publically owned utilities to make a profit.

“During the first world war he served in the navy and he was a member of Lloyd V. Evans Post 375 of the American Legion.

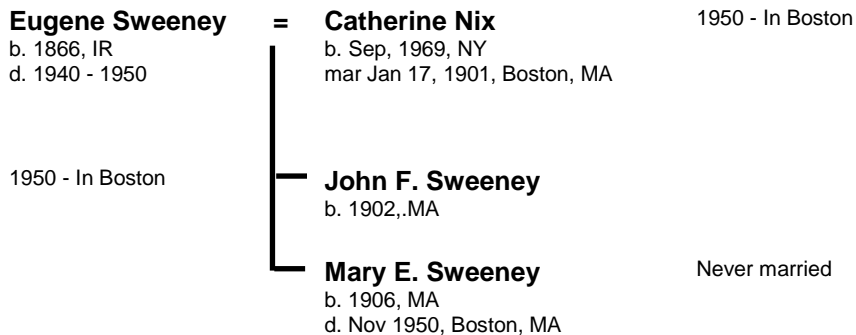

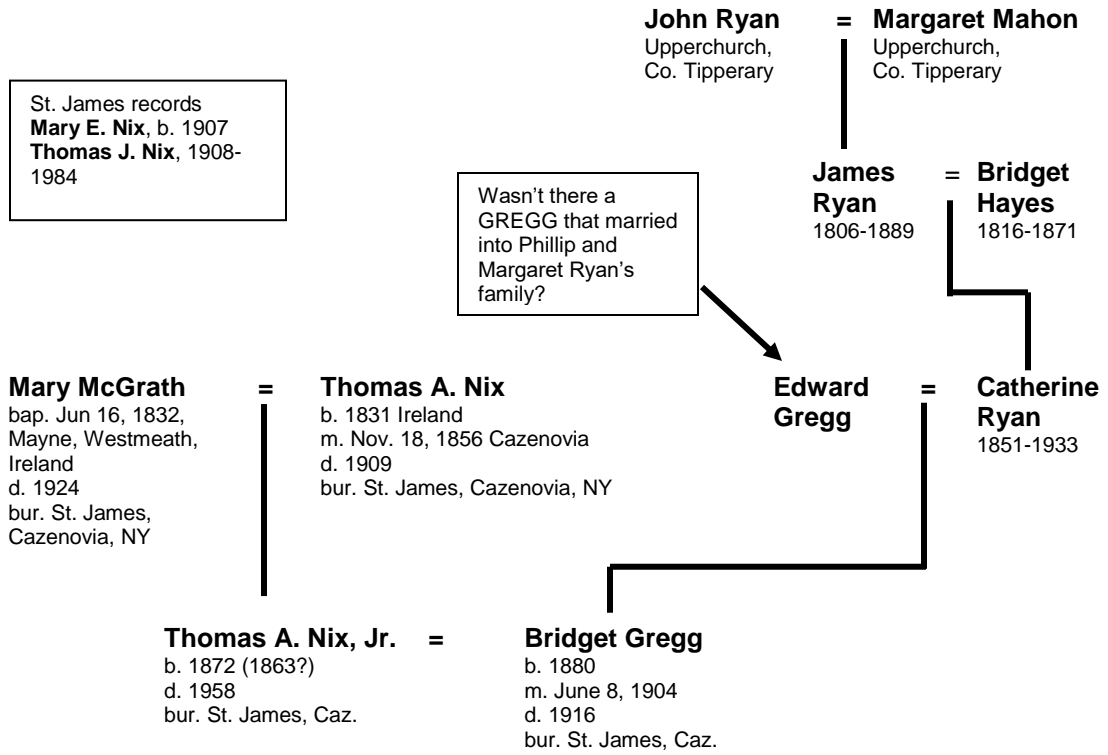

Village Residents Asked to Aid Sidewalk Scapers

“**TRUSTEE H. G. Blodgett**, who is the village committee on streets, and Street Commissioner **George R. Shute** make a request of all village residents. Such large quantities of snow have fallen that the sidewalk scrapers now have no place to push the snow because of the high banks on each side. Just as soon as the scraper goes through, residents are required to throw the loose snow over the bank. 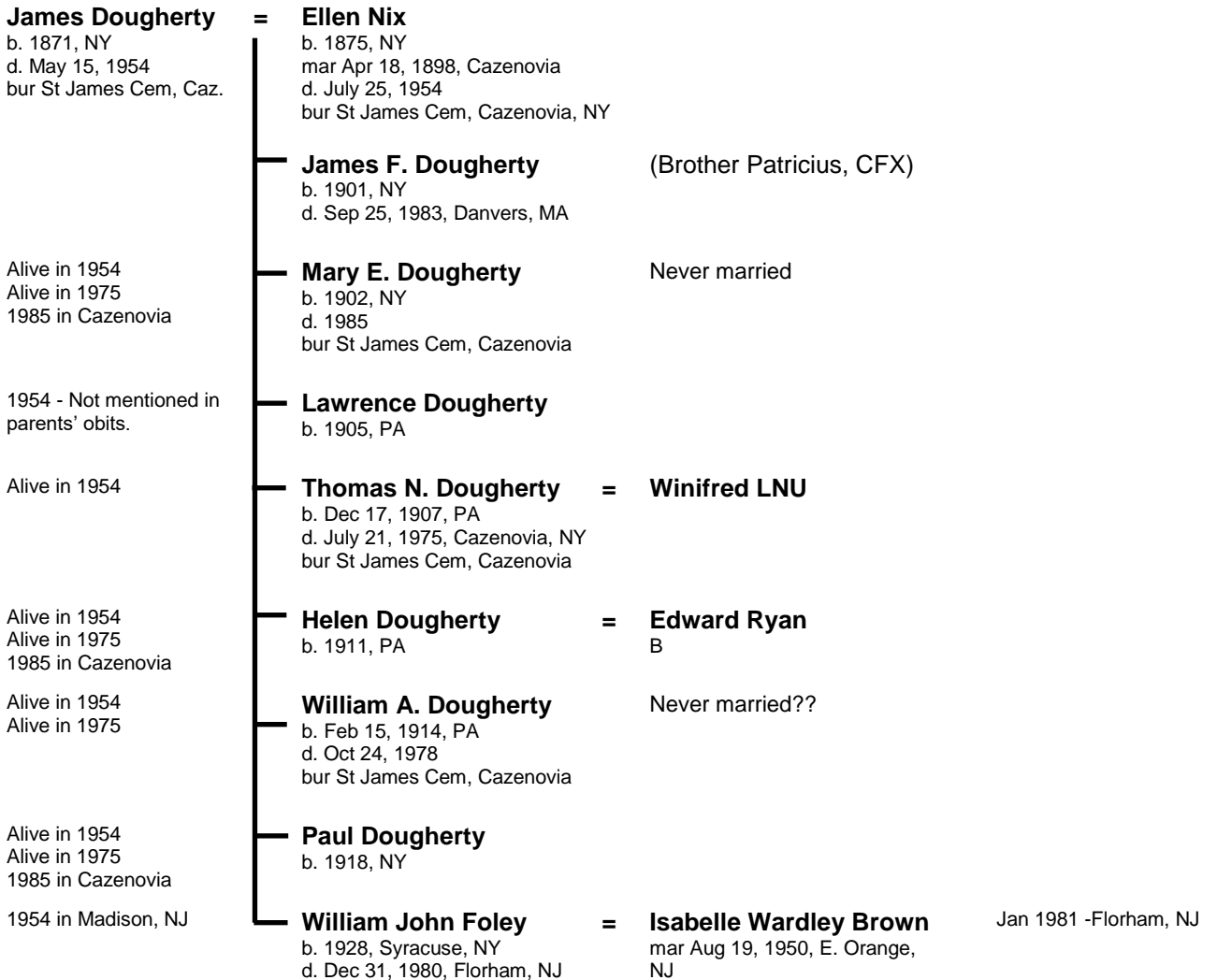

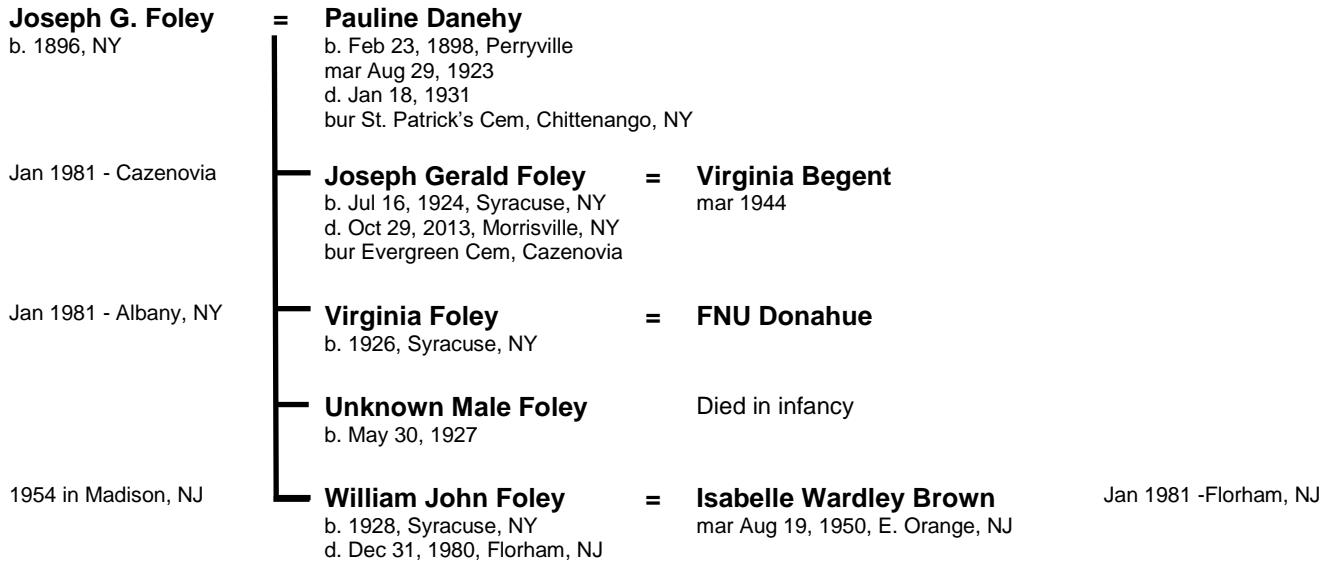

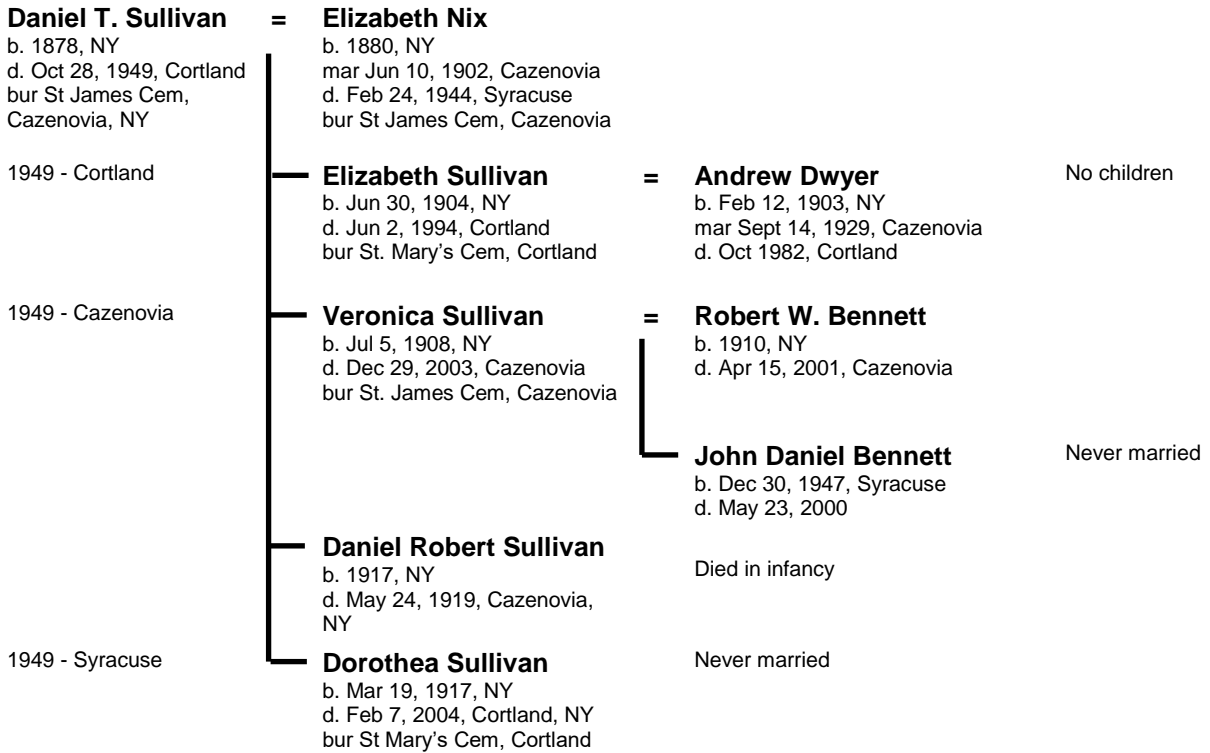

"They were each loaded with about 40 cakes of ice, probably three tons each besides the weight of the trucks and were so close together that even though the ice is about 13 inches thick it was not strong enough to sustain the weight.

"The water was 12 to 14 feet deep, the rear wheels went in the lake while the front wheels were on the ice submerged in water. After considerable work the trucks were pulled out and no damage was done."

Miles was Margaret’s uncle, brother of her mother Mary McGrath. This was about 13 months prior to the death of **Patrick McGrath**, father of Miles and Mary. **Note:** Miles surname in the church records was spelled McGraw instead of McGrath.

1897-03-16 **Miles McGraw** was one of the pall bearers for **Mrs. William Burke** of Fenner. The funeral was at Cazenovia and burial was at the Catholic cemetery.

Business Man Dies at 77 Years — Burial In St. Agnes’s Cemetery

“CAZENOVIA, May 31- The funeral of **Miles D. McGrath**, 77, a business man of this village for a number of years, who died yesterday (May 30th) morning at the home of his niece, **Mrs. Charles Googin** of Sullivan street, will be held tomorrow morning at 9 o’clock in St. James’s Catholic Church. Burial will be made in St. Agnes’s Cemetery.

Appendix

John McGrath Family monument - St. Patrick's Cemetery, Truxton



This is a picture of the John McGrath family monument in the Truxton Catholic Cemetery, in Truxton, NY. This picture was taken looking west in July 1999. The small headstones in front of the monument indicate the final resting place of John and Ellen McGrath and their three children who died shortly after their mother in September 1883 during the diphtheria epidemic.

At the right edge of the picture, on the plot next to John's, is Ann McGrath's monument that was shown on the previous page. It should be noticed that Ann's monument features a Celtic cross while John's monument features a Catholic cross.

Although Patrick McGraw's name does not appear on the monument of his wife Ann the death records from the Town of Cazenovia, Madison County, stated that he was buried in Truxton.

No conclusive evidence has been found so far that would indicate that Patrick and Ann McGraw were related to Edmond and Mary Ryan McGraw. Also, there were no traditions passed down through the generations of our family that would give any indication of a connection between the two families. The fact that their final place of rest was adjacent to John and Ellen McGrath in the Truxton Catholic Cemetery, when they had never lived in the Town of Truxton, is indicative of a possible connection. However, Ann died in May 1883 and Ellen Comerford McGraw didn't die until the end of August 1883 – so Ann was there first.

Patrick and Edmond were similar in age and might have been cousins. They were not brothers because Patrick's father was named Miles while Edmond's father was named Michael. There is not enough room for all the background information but the names Miles and Edmond show up in the descendants of Miler Magrath who was the Archbishop of Cashel & Emly in Co. Tipperary from ~1570 until his death in 1622. This might indicate another yet more remote connection between Patrick and Edmond.

John J. Danehy

The following obituary sketch of John J. Danehy from a recent issue of the Hamilton Republican will interest his former fellow townsmen:

"On Sunday, Feb. 27, at his home on Utica St., occurred the death of **John J. Danehy**, aged 66 years, after an illness of several weeks.

Mr. Danehy was born in Ireland, Nov. 16, 1860, and at the age of four years came with his parents to Madison county where he spent his entire life. He was educated in the Peterboro academy and for several years lived on a farm near Cazenovia. In 1900 he entered the grocery business in Eaton, and later in West Eaton. In 1913 he removed to Hamilton where he established a grocery business. Five years ago he purchased the Nichols and Beal block, but three years ago, because of ill health, he retired from business, and re-entered the business in partnership with his son, Lester, last November. He was a member of the Oneida Council, 473, Knights of Columbus, and for a number of years had been a faithful trustee of St. Mary's church. He was a devoted husband and father, took an active interest in community affairs, and was highly esteemed by a host of friends and business associates.

He is survived by his **wife**, four children, **Miss Agnes Danehy** of Buffalo, **Dr. C. P. Danehy** of Rochester, **Miss Esther Danehy** of Utica, and **Lester J.
