

# Syracuse Fogarty Families

## Introduction

During the research into the Pierce Fogarty family of Syracuse, NY, a number of other Fogarty families were uncovered. Initially it was thought that these other Fogarty families might have been connected to Pierce Fogarty of Thurles, Co. Tipperary and would be useful in determining his connections with the other early Irish families in the city. Subsequently it turned out that there were no obvious connections among the six Fogarty families described in this paper or to the original Pierce Fogarty. It was decided to publish this short paper just so that the information would not go to waste since in the future someone might find it useful. In several cases the families spent a substantial amount of time at a particular address and as a result they were labeled by that address.

### **John Fogarty and Margaret Quilinan - 220 Gifford Street**

John and Margaret were married in Ireland and their first child was baptized in Ireland. The family came to Onondaga County in 1851. They had a son named Pierce (1869-1903).

### **Patrick Fogarty and Margaret Collins**

In the 1910 census it shows that Patrick came to the US in 1888 and Margaret Collins came to the US in 1889. They were married shortly thereafter. Margaret's baptism record was found in the Thurles RC parish - September 27, 1857 and her parents were Pat Collins and Mary Gleeson. They had a son named Pierce (1897-1918).

### **Michael Fogarty and Sarah Grant**

Michael and Sarah were married in Ireland on February 27, 1843 in Upperchurch RC parish, Co. Tipperary. The baptism records of four of their children were found in Lisdonowley, Moyne parish, Co. Tipperary. The family came to the US in 1854.

### **Thomas and Ann Fogarty - 81 Cedar Street**

There is not much information on this family. The family first appeared in the 1850 census and by the 1860 census Ann was a widow. They only had two children.

### **John and Mary Fogarty - 542 Tracy Street**

John and Mary both came to the US in 1870 but didn't marry until 1872. They had 9 children but there are no descendants. Five of their children died young, three of those who survived childhood never married. Only their daughter Anna married (John Mangan) but the couple had no children.

### **John and Johanna Fogarty**

Johanna proved to be mysterious and very elusive. It was the unpaid tax records in the newspapers that tied together Johanna's first husband, John Fogarty and her second husband Florence McCarthy. She and Florence only appeared together in only one census — 1855. There was an article about Florence and Johanna's son by her first marriage drowning while swimming in the Eire Canal in July 1857. Johanna last appeared on an 1860 deed — and then her trail went dark.

Mrs. Margaret T. Loughlin and Mrs. Anna L. Welch were sisters and their parents were the late John and Mary Leighton. In some of the court filings found in the "In The Newspapers" section of this paper these girls were described as heirs to the estate of Catherine Fogarty McDonald and that they were "cousins." This would imply that one of the girls' parents was a sibling of Catherine's parents, John Fogarty and Margaret Quilinan. The only possibilities are Mary Leighton might have been a Fogarty or a Quilinan. However, according to the Find A Grave database, Mary was Mary Theresa Ficher Lighton (1841-1924). She and her husband John Lighton (1840 - Jul 21, 1895) are both buried in St Agnes' Cemetery.

It is unknown why two "cousins" — whose exact connection to the Fogarty family could not be determined — were listed as heirs of Catherine Fogarty McDonald's estate while there was no mention in her will of her late husband Alexander McDonald's three sons, James, John and Thomas.

**Note 1:** In the 1865 census Margaret stated that she had given birth to 8 children. After including Daniel from Ireland and Ellen from Monroe Co. and the other four born in Syracuse the family is still missing 2 children. They might have been born and died between the census records.

**Note 2:** John and Margaret Fogarty would both appear to be age-challenged. John only aged by 1 year from 1870 to 1892. Margaret only aged by one year between 1865 and 1875.

**Note:** How can the parents be Syracuse residents for 4 yrs and their 1 year old daughter was born in Monroe Co. a year ago? The 4 years must be how long the parents have been in the US and not how long they have resided in Syracuse, having arrived in 1851. In the 1900 census John Fogarty stated that he came to the US in 1849, which is only off by 2 years from the 1855 information. The John, Margaret, and Ellen combination doesn't appear in the 1860 census.

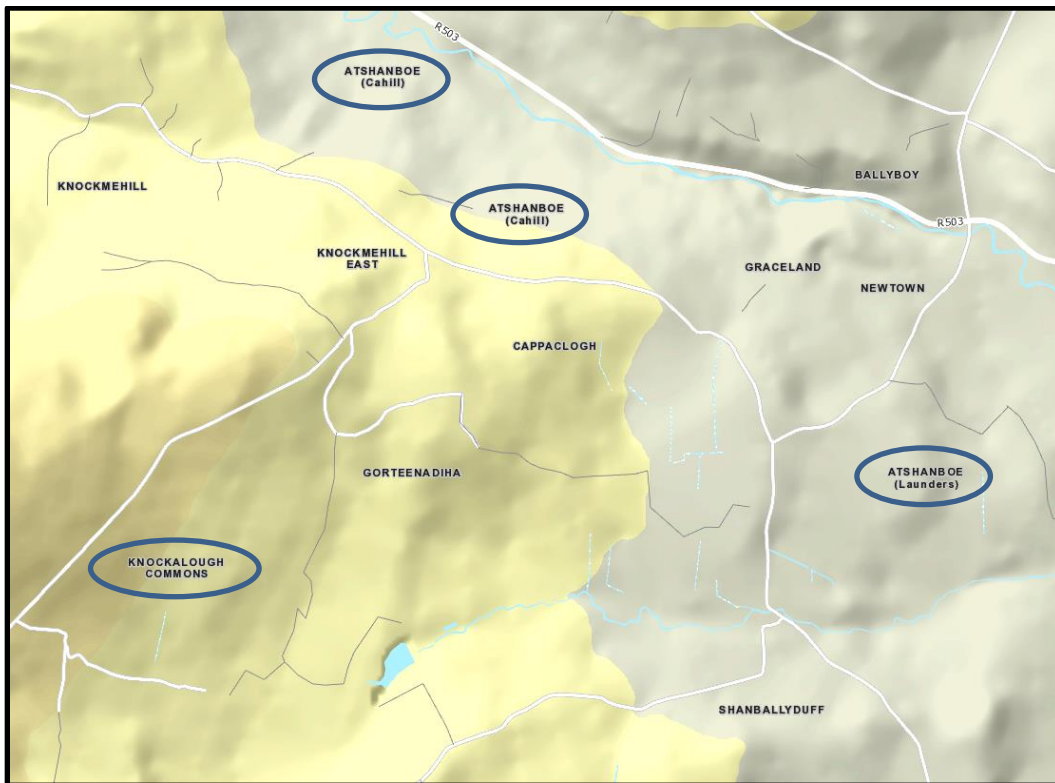
## Tithe Applotment

### JOHN LIGHTON STRICKEN

#### Fell in the Street From a Paralytic Shock

#### He is Now in a Critical Condition — Few Men Are So Well Known in Canal enterprise — His Illness will Bring Sadness to Many

“A few minutes before 7 o’clock this morning **John Lighton** of the Lighton Machine company was on his way to his place of business, when in front of the house of **Dr. Eli Van de Warker** in Fayette park a **Mr. Murphy**, who is employed by **Edward Joy**, a plumber, saw him stagger as if to fall. **Mr. Murphy** rushed to his assistance and caught him, but so great was **Mr. Lighton’s** weight that both men were carried down to the sidewalk. Two of **Mr. Lighton’s** sons were immediately notified of their father’s condition, and he was removed in a carriage to his home, No. 400 Grape street. He was still conscious when removed to the house, but swooned soon afterward and has remained in a stupor ever since. **Doctors Mumford, Ayling and Jacobson** were called. They state that he is suffering from paralysis.

“**John Lighton** is one of the best known citizens of Syracuse where he was born January 20<sup>th</sup>, 1840. His father, whose name he bears, was for many years a well-known butcher and died when **Mr. Lighton** was but a year old. Deprived of his father when so young he was thrown upon his own resources and his achievements are the result of his own efforts. He belongs to the class style self-made. He applied himself when yet a young man and had been a clerk, a bookkeeper and a silversmith. When the war of the Rebellion broke out he saw the opportunities for money making and then went into the grocery business at the first lock near McBride street, and continued in that trade for thirty years during which time he became one of the best known supporters of the Erie canal, and canals in general, in the State.

“**Mr. Lighton** was the first president of the New York Salt company and in the year 1888 he organized the John Lighton Machine company. He is also a director of the North American Salt company. In the fall of 1881 he received the nomination on the Democratic ticket for Member of Assembly and was elected by 157 plurality. He was re-elected to the office by an increase majority, 655. He took a leading part in canal legislation and was the originator and promoter of the bill for doubling the locks of the Erie canal upon which the State has expended more than \$10,000,000.

“Whether **Mr. Lighton** will rally from the present attack the physicians are unable to say. His brother, **James Lighton**, died a few years ago from much the same cause. The death of his brother had a saddening effect upon **Mr. Lighton**, whose nature was of the most genial kind. The death later of his business partner, **Arthur McKeever**, had a depressing effect upon him. These things, together with recent business troubles, probably bore upon him though he heroically tried to bear up through it all. Few men can boast of so many sincere friends as **John Lighton**, and they will learn with unfeigned sadness of his critical illness.”

“**Alexander McDonald**, a workingman living at No. 210 Fabius street and employed at the Kane & Roach factory, was seriously injured this morning about 11 o’clock. A stake under the table at which he was working broke and one of the guide forks made a hole through his left hand, breaking of the bones. The injured man went to his home, where he was attended by **Dr. Clark E. Hinmen.**”

## TROUBLE IN THE FOGARTY HOME

### John Reaches Police Court for Going Home and Quarreling With His Sister

“There is trouble brewing in the Fogarty home, 220 Gifford street. In that home lives **John Fogarty**, his sister and his father, **John**, it is said, lives on Madison street some of the time with a woman of shady character, and when he goes home now and then he makes it lively for the other members of the house.

“John went home yesterday and found his sister there. As usual they had a quarrel and John was arrested. When arraigned in Police court this morning Fogarty said that he was not drunk and that he created no disturbance at home.

“Suddenly a women dressed in black rushed into the court room and confronted the judge. She said:

“‘He is not sober now, judge, he is drunk yet.’

“‘Who are you?’ was asked

“‘Why, I am his sister,’ said the woman.

“**Judge Thomson** asked Fogarty when he wanted his trial adjourned to, and he said he wanted time to get a lawyer. The judge asked him if he could get bail, and he said that he thought he could go on his own bail inasmuch as he had a fourth interest in a \$40,000 estate.

“‘Yes, the state belongs to my father and he is waiting for dead man’s shoes,’ said Fogarty’s sister.

“The case was adjourned until September 11 and the bail was fixed at \$100.”

### **MISS FOGARTY WOULD RATHER CHEW IT**

**Rather Than to Have Any of Her Mother’s Estate Left.**

### **RECEIVER IS ASKED**

**For Interest of Kittie McDonald in the Estate and to Collect Money**

“Whatever is left I would rather eat or chew it up than to have one cent left, and there won’t be a cent left if I can help it,” is the way **Miss Margaret Fogarty** of 220 Gifford street is quoted in speaking of her mother’s estate in the supplementary proceedings that arose over her sister’s alleged board bill. The story came out when **Edward Devine** went in before **Judge Ross** and moved for a receiver to collect whatever interest **Mrs. Kittie Fogarty McDonald** might have in her mother’s estate. The court named **Charles S. Estabrook** as receiver.

“According to the papers **Anna C. Welsh** brought suit against **Mrs. McDonald**, formerly **Catharine Ann Fogarty**, and recovered judgment for \$227.70. Then **Miss Fogarty** was subpoenaed as third party and questioned about her mother’s estate. There was said to be about \$12,000 worth of real estate, the use of which was left to **John S. Fogarty** during his lifetime, and after his death it was to be divided among the children. In the will proceedings it is alleged there was an agreement made to pay **Mrs. McDonald** \$4 a week. It was said she received the money for some time and then the payments ceased. **Miss Fogarty** was made sole executrix of her mother’s will.

“It developed upon the examination that **Mrs. McDonald** left home several years ago, and now only her brother John and sister are living with their father. **Miss Fogarty** was quoted as saying that she had made no agreement to pay her sister anything. The agreement, it was said, was made by the lawyers.

“In the affidavit for a receiver **Mr. Devine** said, upon information and belief, that the estate of **Margaret S. Fogarty** was indebted to the judgment debtor in \$500 arising out of this alleged agreement that she was to receive \$4 a week so long as she remained away from the premises of **Mrs. Fogarty**.”

#### **LEVIED EXECUTION WITHOUT PROPER PROBE, SHE SAYS**

##### **Miss Margaret S. Fogarty in Suit Accuses 1903 Sheriff's Force**

“A failure to properly investigate whether there was sufficient personal property to satisfy a judgment before levying an execution on real estate is charged against the sheriff's force in office in 1903 by **Miss Margaret Fogarty** in a Supreme Court suit started this morning. A default judgment against **John Fogarty** was taken July 25, 1903, by **Otto Johnson** and the real estate was levied upon the same day without an inquiry to ascertain if Fogarty's personal property was sufficient to guarantee the payment of the debt.

“**Miss Fogarty** is the executrix of the ill of her brother, **John G. Fogarty**. Her mother died in 1887 and left the life use of the property at the corner of Gifford and Wyoming sts. to her husband, **John Fogarty**. He died in 1913 and left the property to his son, **John G. Fogarty**, whose death took place on Jan. 29, 1915.

##### **JOHN CLAIMS TITLE**

“In the present suit, **Miss Fogarty** alleges that her father had no interest in the real estate except the life use of it. For that reason, she contends a levy should not have been made on the property, worth \$5,000. **Miss Fogarty** has been receiving the rents until recently. Johnson, who bid in the real estate at the sheriff's sale in 1903, for \$165.55, recently served notice on the tenants to cease paying rent to **Miss Fogarty**, claiming the title himself.

“**Miss Fogarty** offered **Johnson** \$300 for a quit claim deed and he refused to accept the sum. Then she started suit, alleging he had received the real estate without paying adequate consideration for it, and charging him with fraudulently gaining possession of the land. The plaintiff asks to have the sheriff's sale set aside and the amount she should pay **Johnson** for a quit claim deed determined by the court. **Thomson & Byrne** appear for her.”

#### **BAD MANAGEMENT OF REAL ESTATE CLAIM OF HEIRS**

##### **Sister's Heirs Charge Miss Margaret Fogarty Let Property Run Down**

“Unbusinesslike methods tending to depreciate the value of the real estate left by **Mrs. Margaret S. Fogarty**, is charged against her daughter and executrix, **Miss Margaret S. Fogarty**. Objections to the manner in which **Miss Fogarty** has been supervising the property during a period covering the last none years were filed in Surrogate's Court to-day by **Attorney**

**Walter Welch**, executor of the estate of **Mrs. Catherine Fogarty McDonald**, who was a sister of **Miss Fogarty**.

“The objections filed claim that gross negligence on the part of **Miss Fogarty** is responsible for the very slender balance of \$30.30 shown by her accounts filed in judicial settlement. She charged herself with \$13,675.97 and expended \$13,645.67. Had the executrix carefully taken care of the real estate left in her charge **Mrs. Margaret McLoughlin** and **Mrs. Anna Welch**, cousins and heirs of **Mrs. McDonald’s** estate believe the balance on hand would have run up into the thousands instead of being the small amount stated in the schedule.

“In her management of the several pieces of property left in her care, **Miss Fogarty** is charged with being negligent in trying to secure tenants. Some of the property has remained idle and **Mrs. McLoughlin** and **Mrs. Welch** insist on this account the estate was damaged to the extent of \$4,000 and wish to hold **Miss Fogarty** liable for that amount.

“The heirs of **Mrs. McDonald’s** estate allege that **Miss Fogarty** permitted some of the real estate to run down instead of making necessary repairs and they say they suffered to the extent of \$6,000 on this particular charge. **Miss Fogarty** is accused of being careless in the payment of taxes and as a result of her alleged negligence on this point the property was sold for taxes, causing an alleged loss of \$5,000.

“Some of the items on the repair bills have not been paid, they claim. **Mrs. Fogarty** created a trust fund and her property was to pay an income to her husband **John S. Fogarty**. The objections assert that this trust fund ended with the death of Fogarty in August, 1913, and the heirs ask that \$2,465.08 paid for items since his death be stricken out of the account.

“**Miss Fogarty** received one-third interest in the several piece of real estate under her mother’s will. When her brother, **John G. Fogarty**, died he left his share to her. The other one third belongs to **Mrs. McDonald’s** heirs.”

### **Executor of Claimant Against McDonald Estate Is Satisfied**

“Compromise in the settlement of the **Catherine Fogarty McDonald** estate was filed in Surrogate court today by **Walter Welch**, executor of the estate. The disputed point was a claim of \$563.79 of **Helen P. Hannah**, that once had been rejected.

“The settlement was effected with **Florence Hannah**, executor of the estate of the claimant, who has died since that time.

“The executor of the McDonald estate gave the value of the property as \$14,239.05 and reported a net total on hand of \$10,008.15, debts of \$449.06 and expenses of \$3,783.34. The beneficiaries will be **Anna L. Welch** and **Margaret T. Loughlin**, sisters, and **Helen Loughlin**, daughter of **Margaret**.”

“The will directs that the cash bequest be paid to **Mrs. Welch** within 60 days after the death of the testator, and provides that the principal of the residue trust fund may be drawn upon if necessary for her needs.

“Three daughters, **Mrs. Florence E. Irving (Francis)**, 117 Wendell ter.; **Mrs. Veronica Dawson (Ernest)**, 117 W. Borden av., and **Mrs. Anne L. 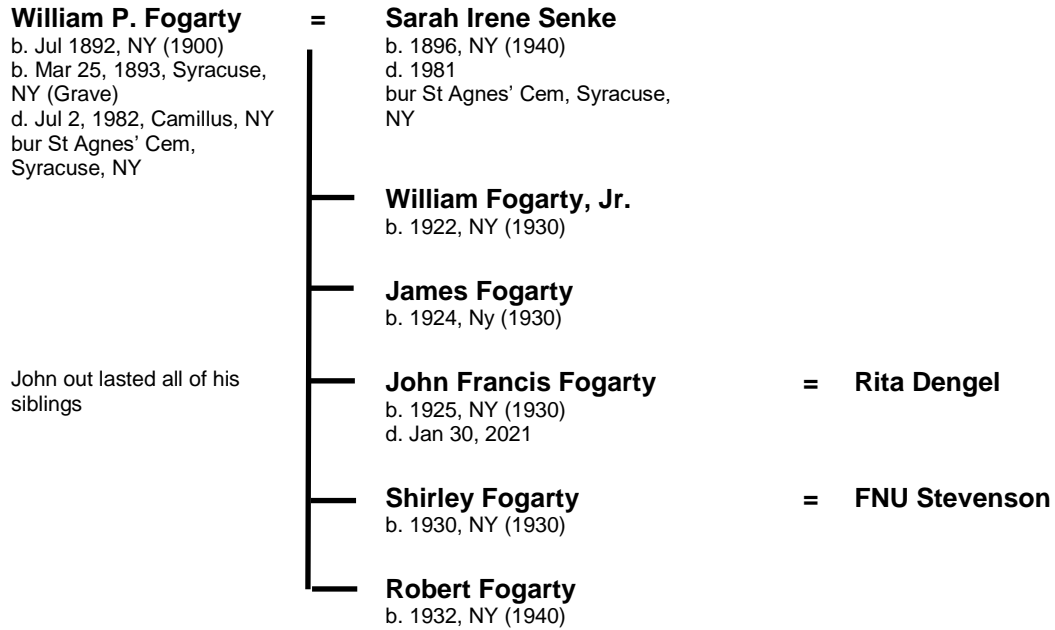

Jack was a Sergeant First Class and served in the Army in the Korean War from 1950 to 1952 and continued to serve in the Army Reserves until 1956. He earned a Bronze Star Medal for Meritorious Achievement in Ground Operations Against the Enemy and earned the Cross for Conspicuous Service. He was later chosen to participate in the Honor Flight Syracuse Mission in 2017.

He taught Biology at North Syracuse High School for 32 years and received many letters from grateful students years after they had graduated. He coached Little League, enjoyed golf, bowling, and later became an official basketball referee. In his retirement years he loved fishing, camping, bus trips, church and the diner, and lottery "scratchers", always hoping for that big win. He was a fiercely loyal Cardinals baseball fan from boyhood and enjoyed the Syracuse games.

He lived a great life and touched many lives including family, friends, students, and strangers alike. His grandchildren benefitted from his wisdom and character and were extremely proud of his service to our country. His kindness extended to the mail person who always found a cold water bottle in the mailbox on hot summer days.



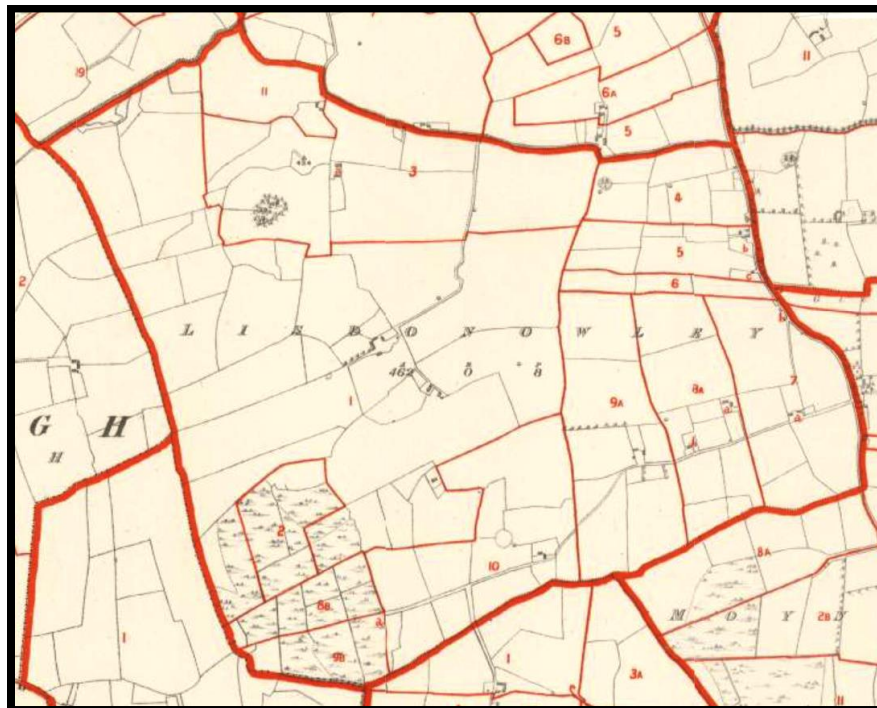

### ENGINEER FOGARTY KILLED IN WRECK

Rear End Collision Near Iron Pier Early This Morning

### CONDUCTOR TENBROECK HURT

Fireman Goodman Escaped by Jumping ---Fire Engine Called to Fight Flames Becomes Stalled in the Snow

Engineer Lawrence Fogarty of 733 Otisco-st, received injuries in a rear end freight collision one-half mile east of the Iron Pier at 3:30 a.m. to-day, from which he died in St. Joseph's hospital three hours later.

Conductor Charles F. Teabroeck of Buffalo was removed to St. Joseph's hospital with a cut over his right eye, a laceration of his scalp, a cut on his left arm, and another cut on his right hand. When his wounds had been dressed he left for his home.

J. M. Goodman, Fogarty's fireman, escaped injury by jumping.

Engineer Fogarty's train crashed into the rear of another freight train on the New York Central freight tracks. Conductor Tenbroeck was in the caboose of the forward train. The caboose and the car ahead was telescoped by the engine of the rear train. Conductor Tenbroeck escaped before the crash came, but he was caught in the debris.

Engineer Fogarty was caught and buried. His right leg was cut off, his skull was fractured at the bone, and he was severely injured internally. He was dug out some time afterward and carried on an improvised stretcher to Spring-st., where he was conveyed as soon as possible by Arthur McKeever in McCarthy's ambulance to the hospital.

The wreck took fire from the engine of the rear train. A telephone alarm was sent in. Assistant Chief Engineer Kantz with Engine No. 4 and hose sleigh started for the wreck. The engine stalled in the snow at Wolf-st. The hose sleigh got to Spring-st., but there found no water. The fire exhausted itself about 5 o'clock. Chief Kantz sent the firemen on to assist in clearing away the debris and rescuing the men.

The car ahead of the caboose was filled with chairs, which rolled down the embankment and many were destroyed. A car of caps was broken open and the contents were strewn about.

The wrecking train was sent out at 5 o'clock, but the tracks were not cleared for several hours.

#### Engineer Fogarty's Life

Engineer Lawrence Fogarty was born in Tipperary, Ireland, 50 years ago. He came to this country when a boy with his mother [and father and sister] and had been employed by the New York Central all his life. He had been an engineer for 25 years. James Fogarty, his younger brother, is also a Central engineer and fired(?) with his dead brother. Both belonged to the Brotherhood of Engineers. Engineer Fogarty was a member of St. Lucy's church and C.M.B.A., Branch No. 50. The funeral will be held on Tuesday at St. Lucy's church at 9:30 a.m.

The survivors are Mrs. Fogarty, two sons, Harry and Ward, one brother, James Fogarty, and two sisters, Mrs. Mary Kelly and Mrs. C. J. Sullivan, all of this city.

The euchre party which was to have been given on Tuesday by the women of the G.I.A. to the Brotherhood of Engineers has been postponed.

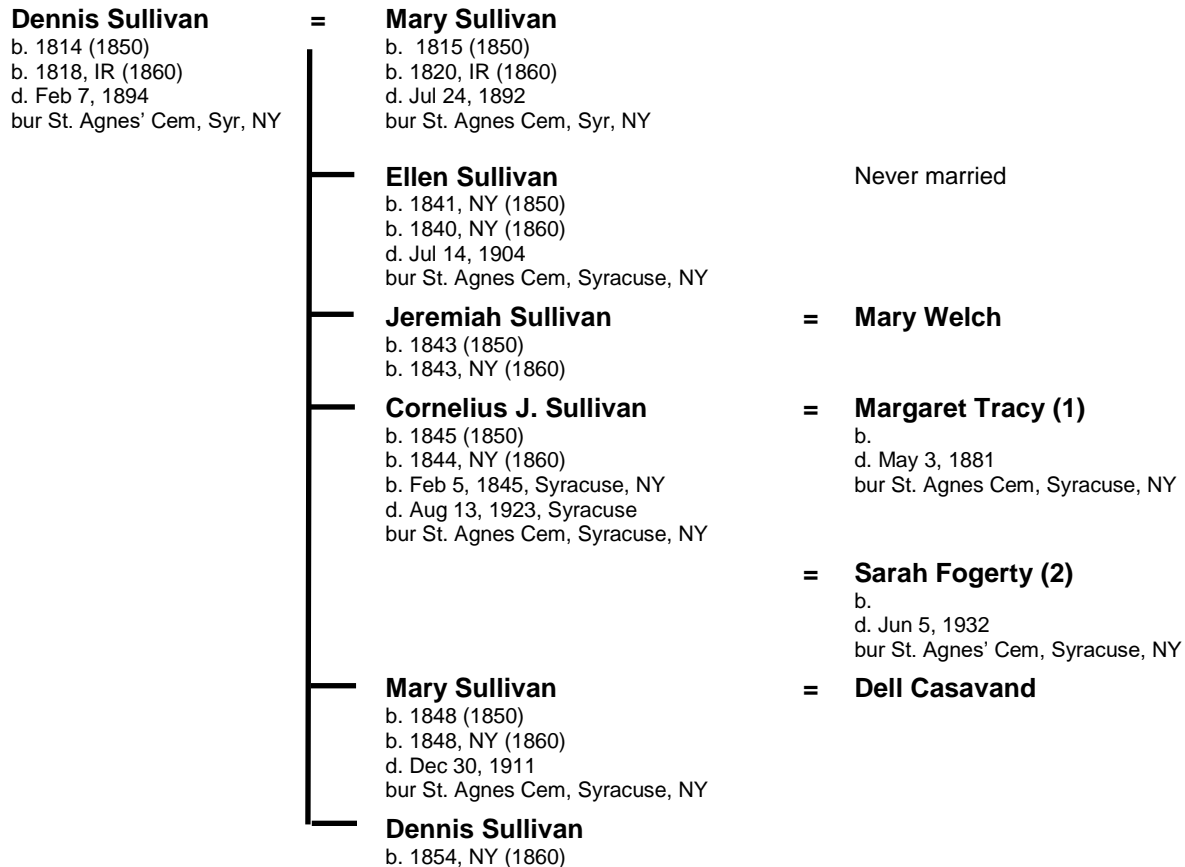
## The Sullivan Families

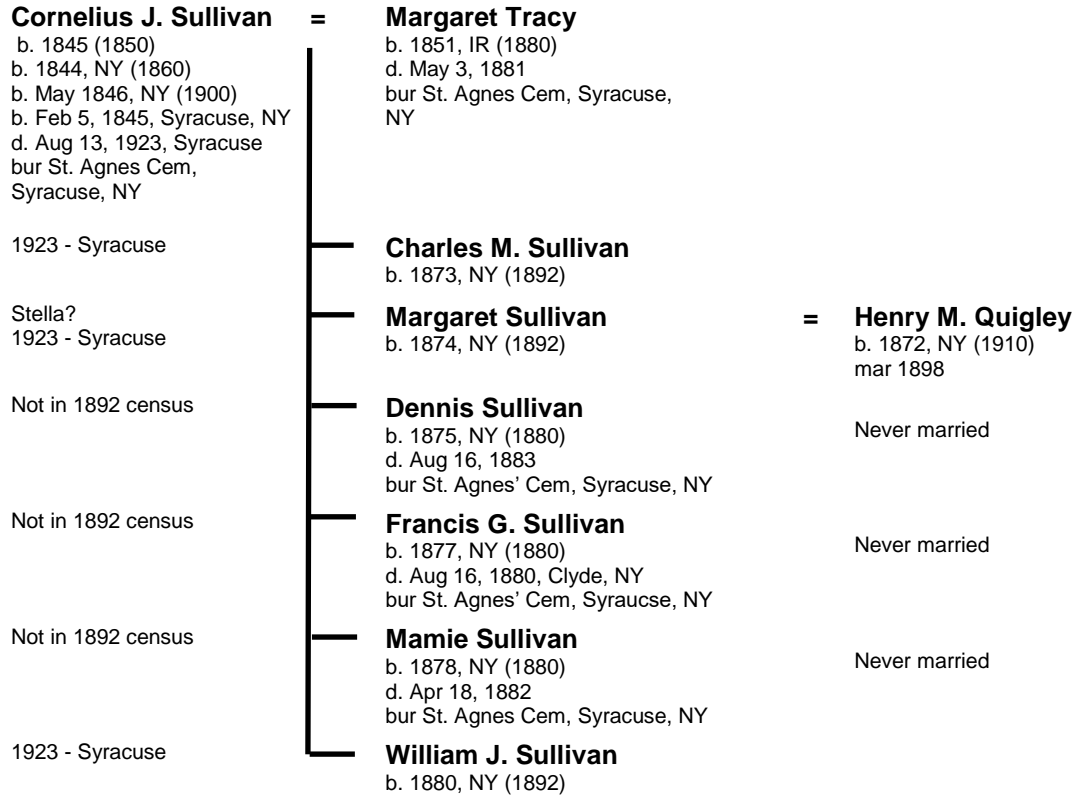

“**Cornelius J. Sullivan** of 501 Stolp ave, retired contractor, died August 13th after a week's illness. 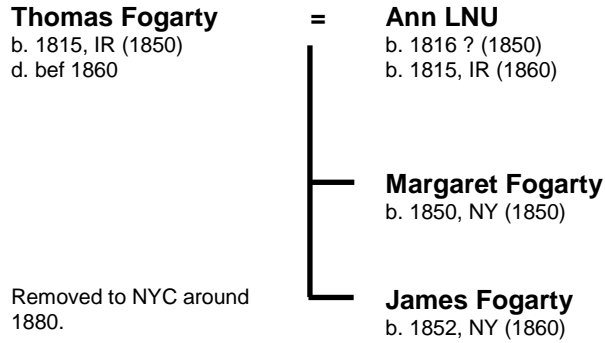

### HE REFUSED BIG BRIBE

**James J. Fogerty Formerly of this City**

### COULD NOT BE BOUGHT

**FOREMAN OF JURY IN BROOKLYN B. T. CONSPIRACY CASE**

**Twenty-five Thousand Dollars Was Offered to Influence Him to Bring in a Verdict of Acquittal or a Disagreement — Green Arrested**

“**George Green, jr.**, of Brooklyn, has been arrested at West Orange, N.J., charged with attempting to bribe **James J. Fogerty**, the foreman of the jury that had been drawn to try Alfred Goslin and others, who were alleged to have entered into a conspiracy to depress the value of the securities of the Brooklyn Rapid Transit company. Fogerty, who formerly lived in Syracuse, says Green offered him \$25,000 to bring about an acquittal or a disagreement.

“Green had been followed for almost a month by **Detective Sergeant Carey** of New York, who finally located him in West Orange, and asked **Chief of Police Bamford** to arrest him. It was suspected that the man wanted was stopping with **Edward A. Noblett**, and a close watch was placed over Noblett’s house. Yesterday Noblett was seen walking along the street with a man who answered the description given of Green. Chief Bamford walked up to the two, and, putting out his hand, said, “Hello, George! What are you doing here?” Green, not recognizing the officer, and thinking that he was an old friend, replied that he was on a short vacation. His arrest followed immediately. Word was sent to New York police, and **Detective Sergeant Carey** went to New Jersey and swore out a warrant on (illegible). Green was arraigned before **Recorder Condit**, who held him as a fugitive from justice, fixing his bail at \$2,000, which was not furnished. Green took his arrest coolly, asserting his innocence, and saying that he would be able show that the prosecution of **Goslin** had attempted to make capital by giving out the story of attempted bribery.

### **Fogerty Is Well Known in Syracuse**

“**Mr. Fogerty** is a former Syracusan, and is well remembered here. He was engaged in the jewelry business in the employ of D. Valentine & Company, and afterwards worked for McCarthy, Redfield & Company, wholesale hardware dealers. About twenty years ago, he removed to New York, where he has since made his home. He is the publisher of the *Jewelers’ Directory*, and Greene was formerly in his employ.

“**James J. Fogerty** when seen at No. 1854 Seventh avenue, in New York, last evening, freely discussed the alleged attempt to bribe him.

“‘Green had once worked for me,’ he said, ‘and I always rather liked him, though I never considered him very sound as to his morals. I was sitting in my office, at No. 176 Broadway, two or three days after the trial began, when green came in and asked to see me alone.

“‘Very well, I said, and led him into an inner office.

“‘When we were seated George said: ‘I understand, ‘Jim,’ that you are on the jury in this Brooklyn Rapid Transit trial.’

“‘Yes,’ I replied, ‘and worse it is for me too. I’m editing a book, and need all the time I can spare to put upon it.’

“‘Glancing at me with an odd expression, Green said, ‘That should not trouble you. Would you accept \$500 for your trouble?’

“‘George, what do you mean?’

**“Twenty-five Thousand Dollars Would About Suit You.”**

“‘Simply this,’ said he, ‘that if you will secure a verdict of not guilty or a disagreement among the jury for Goslin and all except Davis — we don’t care about him — you shall have that amount. I can prove to you that the money will be forthcoming.’

“‘You’re talking nonsense, George,’ said I.

“‘Mistaking my meaning, he said, ‘If that isn’t enough you can have more, I think that \$25,000 would about suit you.’

“‘Who sent you here? I demanded.

“‘I came from Mr. Goslin and the others,’ said Green. ‘They are good fellows, just as you and I. I’ve done some work for them and have found them first rate men to deal with.’

“‘Without further delay I ordered the man from my office, and when he saw that I meant it he left without pressing the matter further. Judge Fursman had warned the members of the jury that we might be approached and had told us to notify him in such an event.

“‘As soon as Green had left the office I went to my lawyer, **William P. Burr**, of No. 120 Broadway. He advised me to tell the Judge without delay, and on the following morning I did so. What happened after that is a matter of record.

“‘Several days after the trial had ended I received an anonymous letter telling me Green’s address and accusing him of several misdemeanors. I turned this over to the city authorities, and I am glad to hear that it has led to the man’s arrest. I do not know whether efforts were made to bribe any of the other jurors. If there had been any attempt I think I should have heard of it. Green is the son of **George Green**, formerly a jeweler, with a store down town. I knew him to be a man of honor and it was for that reason that I employed his son. George was at one time a member of the Thirteenth regiment in Brooklyn, but left the service at Camp Black.

Two of these Fogartys are known to have been buried in St. Agnes Cemetery but none of these Fogartys could be found to be buried there via Find A Grave. In the 1900 census Mary Fogarty reported that she had given birth to 9 children and at the time of the census only 4 of them were still alive. These were Michael, Anna, John and Patrick. The census records were able to account for 7 of the 9 children and the other 2 must have been born and then died between the census takings. To account for these missing children Child1 and Child2 have been placed in the above family in available gaps since nothing is known about these children, except that they had existed.

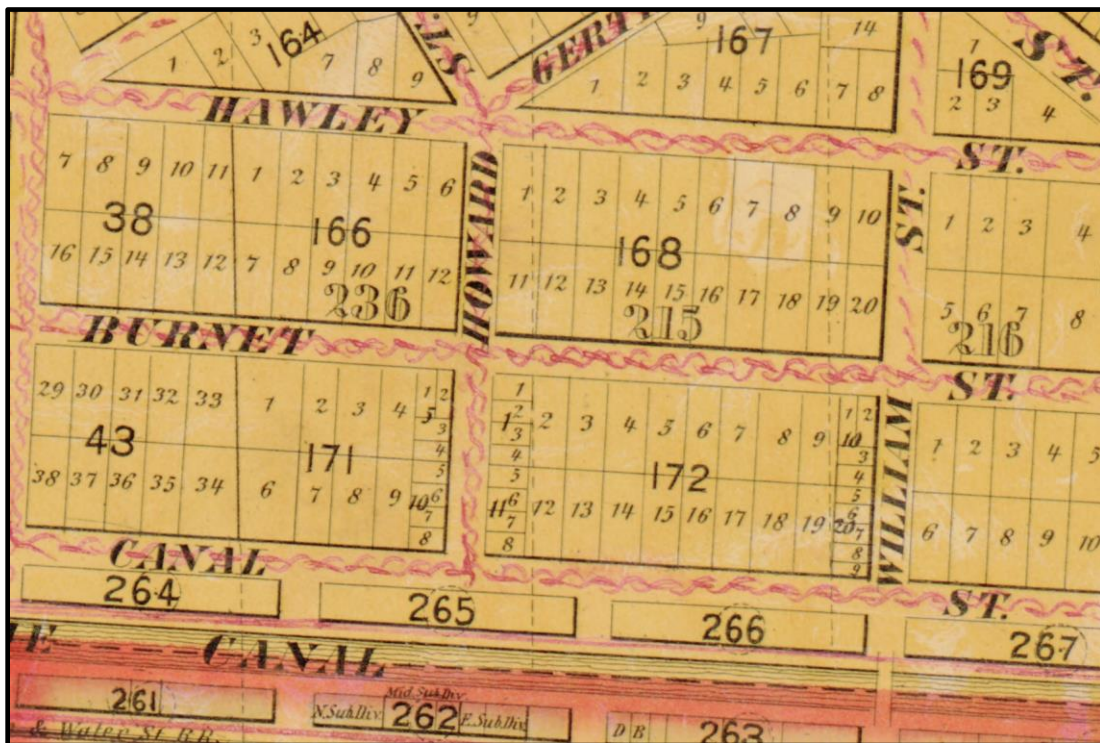

## Death of Florence McCarthy

**MAN AND BOY DROWNED.**—A respectable mechanic named **Florence McCarthy**, and his little step-son, were drowned in the Erie canal between the locks in this city, on Thursday evening last. Mr. McCarthy, who was an excellent swimmer, was bathing in the canal, and swimming about dressed in a pair of overhauls, while his wife stood on the bank. He placed his little step-son on his back and swam across the canal, and on his return a canal boat passed between them and the spectators who stood on the bank. While the boat hid them from view the boy was heard to exclaim, "don't Pa, don't," and nothing more was either seen or heard of them. The persons on the boat apparently neither saw nor heard them.

The alarm was given immediately, but the bodies were not recovered until the level was drawn off. The body of McCarthy was found about midnight, a few rods below the place where he was last seen, but the body of the boy was not found until yesterday morning, when it was discovered in the Onondaga Creek, near the residence of Allen Munroe. The body had evidently passed through the lock gate, and out of the canal through the sewer leading from the weigh lock into the creek. It was considerably marked by the obstructions met with on its passage, and the little fellow's mouth was nearly filled with hair from the father's head, which the boy had evidently caught in his teeth in his drowning agonies.

An inquest was held on the bodies yesterday forenoon, by Coroner Kinne, and a verdict of accidental drowning was returned.

Mr. McCarthy was an industrious and respectable man, and leaves a wife and several children to mourn his untimely fate.
